Peter Buonaccorsi, MD is a child, adolescent and adult psychiatrist in Raleigh with extensive experience working with children and adults with combined medical and psychiatric illness. He trained at Sheppard Pratt Hospital in Baltimore and the Cambridge Health Alliance in Massachusetts, and was a clinical fellow at Harvard Medical School. While in Boston he worked with traumatically burned children at the Shriners' Hospital for Children. Dr. Buonaccorsi is currently training in psychoanalysis at the Psychoanalytic Center of the Carolinas.

Mardy S. Ireland, PhD is a practicing psychoanalyst and psychologist in Raleigh. She is the author of two psychoanalytic books as well as a several book chapters and articles. She taught at the graduate, post-graduate, and psychoanalytic institute level for over 20 years. Since returning home to North Carolina after living years in Hawaii, Washington, DC, and California, her interest now extends beyond clinical work to applying psychoanalytic ideas to community issues and concerns—e.g., questions of gender definitions, problems, and societal possibilities.



Harold Kudler, MD trained in Psychiatry at Yale and is an expert on psychological trauma. After long serving as Associate Director of the VA's Mid-Atlantic Mental Illness Research, Education and Clinical Center (MIRECC) for Deployment Mental Health, he now serves the VA system as Chief Consultant for Mental Health Services. He advises Sesame Street Workshop's "Talk, Listen, Connect" project series to help military children and their families with deployment stress, and advises the "Peaceful Schools" anti-bullying program for the Psychoanalytic Center of the Carolinas.



Natalie Peacock-Corral, LCSW is a psychotherapist and psychiatric social worker in private practice in Raleigh. She is also an avid singer and has performed for many years with local opera companies. A 1996 graduate of the UNC School of Social Work, Natalie completed her post graduate training at Yale Psychiatric Institute and graduated from the advanced psychotherapy program of the Psychoanalytic Education Center of the Carolinas. She worked for many years at Duke Addictions Program and Family Counseling Service.
